



Level One Process Map

1st January 2018

This document details in simple terms the process to progress from Player to L1 Assessed Umpire

- Firstly, discuss with your Club UDO the ways in which you will be able to assist your club by becoming an umpire and how your club will support you through the process
- Look at the L1 courses that are available – details of DHUA courses can be found on the website – all EH courses can be seen by following this link:

- Once you have found a suitable course, click the 'Book Online Now'
- You will be prompted to log in to your EH account (should you already have one) or create an account – you will need an account to be able to proceed
- Log in and book your course and make the appropriate payment
- Log in to the 'HockeyHub' and take the online rules test at: <https://hockeyhub.Englandhockey.co.uk/rules>
- Attend the L1 course
- Receive the welcome email from the DHUA membership secretary and log in to the DHUA website – maintain your personal area and enter availability as appropriate
- Work with your club UDO (and DHUA as required) to umpire training sessions/matches etc to develop your umpiring (remember to enter any matches umpired in your personal area on the website)
- Attend any DHUA development opportunities such as Summer League Coaching and specific events
- If you wish to be assessed, discuss this with your Club UDO or Club Umpire Developer...
- Email the Chief Coach (or any member of the Selection and Coaching Committee) asking for assessment
- Enter availability via your personal area for a range of dates NB this can be done alongside your playing/other commitments (THERE IS **NO** NEED TO STOP PLAYING IN ORDER TO UMPIRE)
Please add notes along the lines of "Assessment Please – playing 1pm at 'xxx' can umpire afterwards"
- NB Before any L1 assessment, DHUA will normally appoint you (to your home club where possible) with a DHUA coach to give you the best possible preparation for your L1 assessment
- DHUA will then appoint you to a match with an Assessor (this may be away from your home club)
- Details of the L1 assessment criteria, process and guidance, are all available via the website
- Having passed your L1 assessment, you are able to umpire the full range of matches – contact your UDO, panel representative or the chief coach for information relating to developing your umpiring further
